'Taxonomy' is the science of classification. Items are sorted into groups based on their *relatedness* to make accessibility easier. Taxonomies might change in certain everyday situations, like the prioritizations a grocery store will give to certain products on sale, or like whether a library chooses to use Dewey Decimal or Library of Congress codes. Other taxonomies remain fixed, like the way online products are organized by gender, price, color, size, etc., like the Periodic Table of chemical elements, like astronomical and biological classifications. Effective taxonomies reduce opportunities to draw wrong conclusions and/or waste valuable time compensating for error.

Rock 'N Learn [R'NL] Phonics YouTube videos receive millions of views.

R'NL employs Science of Reading's conventional method of organizing foundational information per the alphabet: Short-Aa, Long-Aa, Bb-Sound, Hard-Cc, Soft-Cc, etc. 'Phonics' is guilty of misrepresenting the roles which alphabet letters play, delivering deceptive attributions when claiming that sounds are 'made' by letters, usurping the primary standing of the phonic elements. This paper disputes 'phonics' and demonstrates a sounds-based protocol: Heard-Said-Spelled-Read [HSSR]

R'NL A-E-I-O-U-Y are vowels. These letters 'make' vowel sounds.

HSSR Letters are inert representatives of vowel and consonant speech sounds. Sounds have spellings. The best way to learn to read is to learn to spell.

R'NL Vowels (as letters) can 'make' the long sound to say their names.

HSSR 'Long' is a misleading label; most articulations may be lengthened in duration.

R'NL Vowels (as letters) can 'make' the short sound.

HSSR 'Short' is a misleading label; most articulations may be shortened in duration.

R'NL Consonants go with vowels to 'make' sounds and some consonants are silent.

HSSR Many {.Sound+Spellings.} require more than one letter.

R'NL Say the sounds that consonants/vowels (as letters) 'make' when put together.

HSSR Consonants and vowels are sounds. Letters are not consonants or vowels.

R'NL Read those letters. Here's the letter that 'makes' that sound most.

HSSR Hear and say sounds. Spell sounds. Blend and read {.Sound+Spellings.}.

R'NL You don't sound the Letter ____ when you read the word.

HSSR Letters don't have sounds. Letters are not silent. Letters are not noisy.

R'NL Let's learn other ways to 'make' *long* vowel sounds.

HSSR Let's learn to hear and say all MAP units, including the pivotal vowels.

R'NL Watch and you will see. Read these words with me. (visual focus)

HSSR Listen and you will hear. Say these words with me. (aural/oral focus)

R'NL ...sneaky words ...tricky words ...special words to memorize.

HSSR HSSR demystifies pronunciations and spellings. No exceptions.

R'NL Some words don't follow the rules.

HSSR Many rules are nonsense. Dump them!

R'NL Some words aren't spelled like they sound.

HSSR Actually, all words may be spelled exactly as they sound!!

Listen to pronunciations, then spell-out each individual sound-unit.

R'NL Look at words around to sound out the word you don't know.

HSSR Know words-to-be-read ahead of time. No skipping. No guessing.

R'NL Are you ready to learn how to read and spell?

HSSR Are you ready to learn how to pronounce, spell and read with confidence?

R'NL Practice makes perfect.

HSSR Practice makes *permanent*. Be mindful of what you are practicing!!

R'NL Part 4 of 4 [25:11] – These words *don't follow the rules for letter-sounds*.

HSSR Heard-Said-Spelled-Read is the durable teaching protocol appropriate for any word-to-be-read.

**Heard-Said-Spelled-Read is literacy's *soudest* venture.
No nonsense. No neglect.**

'Sound' means both things for HSSR:

- (noun) individualized vibrations of spoken language as perceived by listening
- (adjective) free from fallacy

As a protocol, *{.Sound+Spelling.}* demonstrates the true relationship between spoken language's **SOUNDS** and written language's **LETTERS** or groups of letters. Sounds are sounds and may (or may not) be spelled-out in various ways, including using the alphabet. Letters are never vowels. Letters are never consonants. Letters don't have sounds and don't make sounds.

HSSR asks, "Are you ready to learn how to *pronounce, spell, and read?*"

If so, the way foundational elements are organized in your thinking makes a difference.

HSSR is a sound, sounds-based protocol to enlighten language learning at any age or stage by explicit pronunciations and relevant spellings. Letters remain inanimate.









VOWEL codes are V01 through V15, plus C39+V09 and C39+V15.
 CONSONANT codes are C16 through C39, plus seven unique blends.

Block all deceptive phonics jargon! No more *short, long, hard, soft* letters.

HSSR’s MAP provides a predictable, comprehensive bedrock while its representative words/mascots are changeable according to your personal preferences. For adult learners, find the sounds in more sophisticated language:

[V01] algorithm; [V04] adult; [V05] anywhere; [V06] alien; [V07] aisle; [V10] aeon; [V11] auto/car

Please stop teaching these erroneous phonics concepts.

- Consonants and Vowels as Letters – *Vowels and Consonants are sounds!*
- Beginning, Ending Consonants, and Blends as Letters – *Sounds are sounds!*
- Silent-E – *Letters are not either noisy or quiet!*
- Short and Long Vowels – *Duration may be applied equally!*
- R-Controlled Vowels – *Letter Rr is powerless!*
- Sight-sounded Multi-syllable Words – *All words can be HSSR!*

WordsAhead insists that learners deserve to receive correct, direct instruction.

Visually-based ‘letter-sound’ strategies asking learners to ‘sound-out’ or memorize whole printed words are riddled with opportunities for mistakes. On the one hand, many phonics rules are simply nonsense. On the other hand, it is neglectful to expect whole words to be ‘seen-and-said’ enough times to be memorized.

All word study can be relevant when you show context, then provide HSSR information ahead of asking the learner to decode the source text.

R’NL The sound ___ is ‘made’ by the Letter ___. Letter ___ makes different sounds.
HSSR {*.Sound+Spelling.*} disambiguates pronunciation.
In the word *read*, [V05] is spelled Letters EA. {.V05/ea.}
Letters EA are used to spell other sounds, too.
In the word *read*, [V10] is spelled Letters EA. {.V10/ea.}

R’NL Two consonants together ‘make’ only one sound.
HSSR Spellings may require more than one letter. Listen, then spell.

R'NL Letter is silent when it comes after .

HSSR Letters are inert. Letters are not noisy. Letters are not silent.

R'NL Consonant Rr after a vowel can change how the vowel (as if a letter) sounds.

HSSR Vowels are sounds, never letters. Letter Rr is juxtaposed to all letters.
